**CONSOLIDATING MUNICIPAL  
ELECTIONS WITH STATEWIDE  
GENERAL ELECTIONS**

**2.03.010 Municipal election date.**  
 The municipal election held on the second Tuesday of April in even numbered years before the effective date of the ordinance codified in this section, is consolidated with the statewide general election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even numbered year pursuant to Government Code Section 36503.5. This consolidation shall become operative with the municipal and general statewide elections held in the year 1992. (Ord. 474 § 1 (part), 1991)

**2.03.020 Extension of office.**  
 Those city officers whose terms will otherwise expire in April, 1992, shall continue

in their offices until no later than the fourth Tuesday after the date of the municipal election held in conjunction with the statewide general election in 1992 and until their successors are elected and qualified. (Ord. 474 § 1 (part), 1991)

**2.03.030 Approval by board of supervisors.**

The ordinance codified in this chapter shall be submitted to the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors for approval pursuant to Government Code Section 36503.5 (a)(1) and shall become effective upon such approval.\* (Ord, 474 §1 (part), 1991)

Editor's Note: The ordinance codified in this chapter was approved by the board of supervisors on September 10, 1991.

**2.03.040 Voter notification.**

Within thirty days after the ordinance codified in this chapter becomes effective under the provisions of Section 2.03.030, the city clerk shall cause a notice to be mailed to all registered voters of the change in election date. The notice shall also inform voters that as a result of the change in election date, elected city officeholders' terms in office will be extended as provided by law. (Ord. 474 § 1 (part), 1991)
